Portions of the Wellness Policy pertaining to student celebrations and fundraising

All foods <u>offered</u> on the school campus will meet or exceed the USDA Smart Snacks in School nutrition standards

- 1. Celebrations and parties. The district will provide a list of healthy party ideas to parents and teachers, including non-food celebration ideas. Healthy party ideas from the <u>Alliance for a Healthier Generation</u> and from the <u>USDA</u>.
- 2. Classroom snacks brought by parents. The District will provide to parents <u>a list of foods and</u> beverages that meet Smart Snacks nutrition standards; and
- 3. Rewards and incentives. The District will provide teachers and other relevant school staff a <u>list of alternative ways to reward children</u>. Foods and beverages will not be used as a reward or withheld as punishment for any reason, such as for performance or behavior. (Alliance for Healthier Generation examples)

Fundraising

Foods and beverages that meet or exceed the USDA Smart Snacks in Schools nutrition standards may be sold through fundraisers on the school campus* during the school day*.
